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

Licence Activities

- I work closely with Jennifer at the CASC-OR office for the granting of A licences, interviewing and approving new B licence holders, A licence upgrades and licence reinstatements.
- In 2025:
 - A Licenses Granted 234 (222) licence holders
 - B Licence Drivers Granted 122 (121) licence holders



Accreditation of Race Licence Schools

I work closely with accredited CASC-OR race schools

Observations/Marshal Observation Program

- Observations are done for a variety of reasons mostly for new drivers, licence upgrades and on occasion for driver reviews as requested by race officials such as the Race Director, the Stewards and the Clerk of the Course.
- Observations are completed using talents of the Marshals, the Stewards, and the Clerk of the Course.



Granting of Single Event Waivers

• I work closely with the Registrar to grant special one Event waivers to selected drivers from other racing organizations that do not have reciprocal licence status with CASC-OR, or require special permission to participate in a CASC-OR Event.



Race Medicals

- Working closely with CTMP Medical Director Dr. Christi Kim and Dr. Bill Liang.
- We setup a race medical clinic in March 2025 in Burlington, Ontario.
- Plans are to run another day in 2026

Volunteers & recruitment

- It takes an army of volunteers to run a race weekend.
 - Registration, paddock/parking, scrutineering, pit lane, false grid, flaggers, pace car, Race Control, stewards, competitor services, organizers.
 - Roughly 1:2 to 2:3 ratio of volunteers to competitors.
- Need to have continuous infusion of new volunteers.
- Especially valuable are racers and crew who might be available on a weekend, even if just for a few hours.
- Recruiting email will be sent early next year.
- Other opportunities: Motorama, QR codes, social media.



Driver Conduct & Competitors' Rights

- Everyone wants to have fair and consistent officiating.
- Not everything is reported to Race Control for further actions.
 - We do not have infinite volunteers.
- If you feel something was not properly addressed, please bring your enquiry to the Clerk.
 - Not everything gets reported to Race Control.
 - If something wasn't right, don't assume it was reported.
 - Reporting after a weekend leaves officials with no recourse to address concerns.



Improvements

- A penalty guideline document for officials and competitors.
- Discussing how to better access Chief officials to report an issue.
 - Positioning an official in the paddock to take enquiries.
 - Online reporting system like VARAC.
 - Communications tools like text messaging, WhatsApp or Sportity.



2026 Race Regs

- Asking for feedback by end of October.
- Draft available in December for review, and official publication once approved.
- Changes under discussion
 - New SA2025 helmet. SA2015 helmets will expire Dec 31, 2026.
 - Update Miata Canada Cup to more closely match SCCA.
 - Introduce PIRELLI Tire Super Touring GTU class for cars faster than 1m23 @ CTMP.

Paul Subject Formula Drivers' Rep VARAC VP Formula Classic



- Over the past several years, the Formula Classic/Formula Libre (FC/FL) grid has been declining and was not generating sufficient numbers to justify the class:
 - In 2022 the average FC/FL grid was 17.3 race cars per race weekend
 - In 2023 the average FC/FL grid was 14.6 race cars per race weekend
 - In 2024 the average FC/FL grid was 13.6 race cars per race weekend
- In January of 2025, Pat Cyr, CASC-OR Race Director, asked me to spearhead a task force to build the grid of FC/FL grid, this coincided with my election to the VARAC Board as VP of Formula Classic.
- The plan developed to form a task force to build the FC/FL grids.



The Steps for the FC/FL Task Force in 2025

- 1. Form a working committee of interested FC/FL drivers with the goal towards building the FC/FL grid.
- 2. Engage with the F1200's to monitor their future growth and engage in their participation in the FC/FL grid.
- 3. Canvas FC/FL car owners using the VARAC and CASC-OR driver database to determine their interest in participating in the FC/FL grid.



- 4. Revisit the VARAC Drivers Challenge points layout to determine if it will have any impact on improving FC grid numbers.
- 5. Review the number and location of FC/FL events to optimize grid numbers.
- 6. Reach out to the regional race groups and clubs to determine the opportunity for cross participation on the FC/FL grid.
- 7. Work closely with CASC-OR and the local clubs to develop joint and alternative strategies to build the FC/FL grid.



Accomplishments of the FC/FL Task Force

- 1. Form an FC/FL working committee: The Formula Classic/Formula Libre Task Force had its first meeting on the 31st of March and has met every month since. Key accomplishments: reaching out to the FC/FL community to stimulate attendance, setting up a For Sale/For Rent page on t the CASC-OR and VARAC websites, completing the Drivers Orientation Program video for FC/FL drivers which will be loaded to the VARAC YouTube channel this fall
- 2. Engage with the F1200's: We regularly have 8 to 10 F1200's on the FC/FL grid which has helped build the FC/FL grid numbers.



- 3. Canvas FC car owners using the VARAC and CASC-OR driver database: We reached out to 30 FC drivers and 20 FL drivers via email to set up phone interviews, we were successful in talking with 17 FC drivers and 6 FL drivers about their interest in participating on the FC/FL grid we received some excellent feedback resulting in actions for the FC/FL Task Force to undertake.
- 4. Revisit the VARAC Drivers Challenge points layout & reviewing the number and location of VARAC FC events: we worked with Dave Good, VARAC to update the VARAC Drivers Challenge point of the FC drivers.



- 5. Review the number FC/FL events to optimize grid numbers: we worked closely Pat Cyr to reduce the number of FC/FL race weekends to build the FC/FL grid numbers.
- 6. Reach out to the regional race groups and clubs to determine the opportunity for cross participation on the FC/FL grid. We regularly sent out emails and had in person conversations to stimulate FC/FL grid participation.



- 7. Work closely with the CASC-OR and the local clubs:
 - Work closely with Pat Cyr and interface with local clubs to build/develop new drivers for the FC/FL grids — we have 6 new drivers across the FC/FL grids this season.
 - We are developing the CASC-OR Open Wheel Invitational July 24th to 26th, 2026 this work is ongoing



- In 2025, the FC/FL grid averaged 19.5 race cars per grid, up substantially from the 2024 average FC/FL grid of 13.6 race cars per race weekend.
- Our plan in 2026 is to continue the work of the FC/FL Task Force by:
 - focusing on getting more new drivers into open wheel cars by continuing to promote the open wheel race cars for sale or rent and having spring test days at Toronto Motorsports Park in a variety of open wheel cars for prospective drivers.
 - Promoting the CASC-OR Open Wheel Invitational July 24th to 26th, 2026

How did we do in 2025?



- We held a 6 event series in 2025 with activities at:
 - Canadian Tire Motorsport Park (CTMP)
 - Shannonville Motorsports Park (SMP)
 - Calabogie Motorsport Park (CMP)



- Plus...

- The Miata Canada Cup was a support race at the Ontario Honda Dealers Indy - Toronto



- Performed a detailed analysis of 2025 (24) CASC OR entries
 - GT Sprints 134 (108) entrants 291 (244) entries or 2.2 (2.3) per driver
 - Miata Canada Cup 35 (34) entrants 97 (88) entries or 2.8 (2.6) per driver
 - FL (Libre, F4, Rad) 23 (29) entrants 72 (31) entries or 3.1 (1.1) per driver
 - FPC 36 (27) entrants 43 (42) entries or 1.2 (1.6) per driver
 - VARAC (VH, CL, FC) 147 (153) entrants 188 (161) entries or 1.3 (1.1) per driver
 - F1600 (4 events) 29 (34) entrants 75 (75) entries or 2.4 (2.2) per driver
 - Overall 404 (379) entrants 766 (644) entries or 1.9 (1.7) per driver



Average entry in 2025 was 118 (106) cars per event
